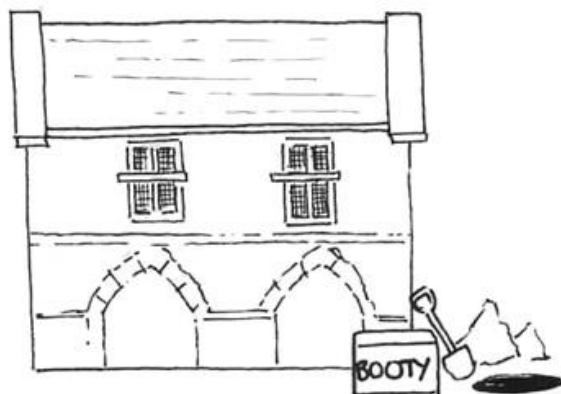
Afterwards **Parade along Main Street** to St John the Baptist Church led by the Ashbourne Town Band. All village groups are welcome to join the parade.

For a third year Matlock Cycling Club is organising a Hill Climb up East Bank, starting outside The Old Bowling Green Inn and finishing on The Common.

2 – A Club Event. This is for anybody, whether a cycling club or not. Riders can enrol on the evening at 6.30pm. Results will be published locally.

Registration – In the car park of The Old Bowling Green Inn from 6.30pm.

Entry Fee – Open event £5. Club event £3. (Covers personal insurance).

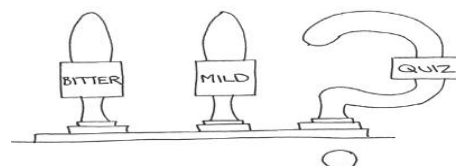

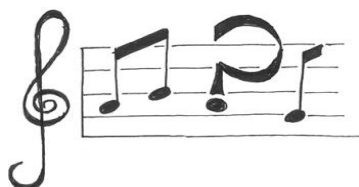

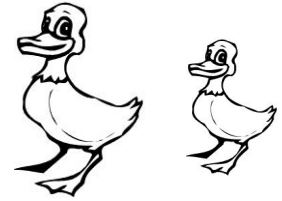
